#### WHAT HAS BEEN DONE SO FAR?

Each partner has created project teams based on criterias. Initially the competition for the project's logo was held. During two online meetings on 2nd February and 26th May participants of the project discussed plans and current issues to make cooperation effective and fruitful. The Management Plan was presented by the Polish coordinator whereas the Visual Identity, Digital Education Materials, Sustainability and Dissemination or Monitoring and Evaluation Plan by the other partners. One of the results of the FCL project is: "Guide for the Future Classrooms". Preparatory activities A1 i A2 to the intellectual output R1 of the project have been taken into consideration. Digital Needs Analysis will be prepared by all partners. Data collection will be connected with digital needs from different points of views: students, parents and teachers. The questionnaire aims to analyze the incoming trends regarding digital education and competences necessary to foster its implementation in the intellectual output.Based on the results obtained by each partner research called Country Digital Report the partners will create the real introduction to the Guide for the Future Classrooms. This study will provide a complete analysis of the current situation about how the situation after pandemic Covid-19 has changed the digitalization and what are fundamental tendences. Dissemination of the activities is led by many possibilities: E-twinning project's account, the project's website with eu domain fcl-erasmusplus.eu, Future Classrooms' Leadership -project's website on Facebook, institutions' Facebook or local newspapers and portals.
