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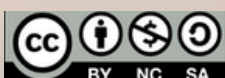

WHAT WE DID

The 5th LTT (Long-Term Training) mobility held in Poland has a rich agenda focusing on the importance of artificial intelligence and gamification in education. The event, which started with the welcome speech of President K. Łachmanski, took place in the Concert Hall of Polonia House. Workshops on artificial intelligence and gamification in education were organized under the leadership of Education instructor B. Hejne. In these workshops, how to use artificial intelligence tools effectively by teachers, how to gamify lessons, and the latest trends and tools in education were discussed.

At the same time, another workshop led by Beata Hejne discussed implications of Kirkpatrick and Sweller theories, best practices for using games in the classroom, and how to gamify the science laboratory. These workshops provided participants with information about the effective elements of gamification in education.

Finally, beyond the theoretical knowledge on gamification in education, the topic of designing educational games using artificial intelligence was discussed in a workshop led by Education instructor A. Popławska. The event provided participants with a valuable educational experience by offering a program full of rich workshops, city visits and practical information.

As part of the event, the opportunity to visit historical places of Toruń was also offered. This trip provided participants with a cultural experience while also providing opportunities for interactive learning.

2ND TPM IN TOKAT, TURKIYE

The two-day program, held in Tokat Turkey on 11 and 12 December 2023, included various activities aimed at improving cooperation and information sharing among participating educational institutions. The first day started with welcome speeches by the School Principal and the Provincial Director of National Education, followed by the engaging, ice-breaking game "Truth or Lie". Participants also enriched the introductory session by enjoying an interactive Kahoot game about the city and school. The agenda included important discussions regarding budget, management and documentation requirements, ensuring transparency in project planning. The day ended with school visits to National Lottery İhya Balak Science High School and Tokat National Lottery İhya Balak Science High School, giving a first-hand look at the educational environment in Tokat.



The second day focused on strategic planning and thinking. The morning started with a welcome coffee and discussions on methods of writing the final report. Presentations on sustainability and dissemination plans were made by ASOCIATIA EDULIFELONG and provided information on the progress of the project. The day also included preparations for the Multiplier Event (M.E), which will be held on December 13 with an international plan presented by the hosting partner from Turkey. Partners carried out a comprehensive overview of the project status and task allocation revisions. The field trip to Zile and hands-on training on the Future Classroom Laboratory (FCL) approach in education highlighted innovative teaching methodologies. The day ended with a visit to Ballica Cave, which offered participants a rich mix of professional development and cultural experiences, and a dinner meeting held at Tokat National Lottery İhya Balak Science High School.

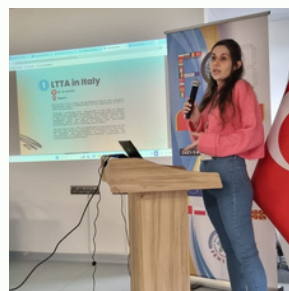


The day featured informative sessions from a variety of speakers, including insights into online literacy, the importance of creating VR content for educational purposes, and the Future of Classroom Learning (FCL) approach.



The Multiplier Event of the Erasmus+ KA220 Future Classes Leadership project took place on 13 December 2023 at Tokat Provincial Directorate of National Education.

The event began with a warm welcome speech from the school principal, followed by presentations from the project coordinators highlighting key areas of focus, including Classroom of the Future design and innovative aspects of gamification.



The event successfully blended online participation with virtual participants over 100 and local participants over 50, creating a diverse and comprehensive interaction platform. The event ended with a certificate ceremony, followed by a formal dinner at Grand Ali's Hotel, which increased the camaraderie among the participants.



M.E. IN PULTUSK, POLAND

The conference, held on January 11, 2024, provided an enlightening platform for educators, focusing on the "Leadership of Future Classrooms" (FCL) project. The event started with the registration of the participants, followed by the opening speech of FCL Project Coordinator Monika Jaworska and Principal of Irena Szewińska State Primary School No. 4 in Pultusk. In the online presentations of the project partners in Italy, Bulgaria, Romania, North Macedonia and Turkey, the effective use of modern technology in the classrooms of the future, teaching methodologies, long-term project benefits, developed methods and the importance of digitalization in education were discussed.



The lunch sessions included Monika Jaworska's presentation "Guidelines for the Classroom of the Future", an important outcome of the FCL project. Marcin Paśnikowski's expert talk focused on the topic "Developing Key Competencies in the School of the Future", which provides valuable information regarding educational projects within the Erasmus+ programme.

Beata Hejne, an advocate of gamification in education, gave a presentation on "Innovative Teaching in the Classroom of the Future", discussing the roles of both teachers and students in the evolving educational environment. The conference concluded with a Kahoot quiz testing participants' knowledge of the FCL project, followed by a panel discussion on effective teaching strategies in future classrooms. The event provided a comprehensive overview of the goals and results of the FCL project, encouraging collaboration and knowledge exchange among educators.



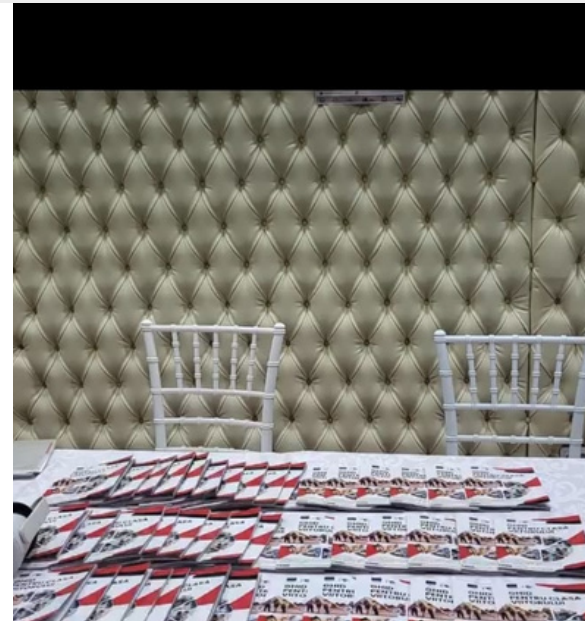
M.E. IN TARGU JIU, ROMANIA

The 3rd Multiplier Event for the Future Classrooms' Leadership Erasmus+ KA220 project was held on January 20 2024 at Hotel Ramada, Targu Jiu, Event room nr 3, for face to face participants, and via Teams for virtual participants.



The event began with the arrival and registration of various participants attending the training, creating an atmosphere of anticipation. Liviu Udrescu's warm welcome and Iohana Udrescu's Erasmus+ views set the tone for the day. While Mircea Ionut Catrina was researching the educational needs of the Alpha generation, Grigore Alexandrescu emphasized the importance of outdoor education.

Liviu Udrescu gave a comprehensive overview of the project, its goals, partners and impact. Practical issues were discussed in Madalina Bisteanu's session on the implementation of lesson scenarios, followed by interesting workshops conducted by Eleonora Preda and volunteer children. The lunch break facilitated informal discussions and the event concluded with feedback from participants highlighting the collaborative spirit.



With 136 attendees, 56 in-person and 80 online, the event successfully spurred a global discussion on the future of education. Participants were encouraged to provide feedback through an evaluation survey for future improvements.
